

## COVID-19: Devolved Administrations

The Chancellor has clarified that as part of additional measures to tackle the coronavirus outbreak, devolved administrations will receive funding to support businesses in Scotland, Wales and Northern Ireland. UK-wide measures are available [here](#). Devolved administrations have also announced the following measures to support businesses:

### Wales



#### Business Rates Holiday

In Wales, retail, leisure and hospitality businesses with a rateable of £500,000 or less will receive 100% rates relief between 1 April 2020 until 31 March 2021. This will be administered through the business rates system. You do not need to do anything. Your local authority will contact you.

#### Grants

- Businesses in Wales that receive Small Business Rates Relief will receive a cash grant of £10,000.
- Retail, leisure and hospitality businesses with a rateable value between £12,001 and £51,000 will receive a cash grant of £25,000.
- Small businesses who employ up to nine people can apply for a grant up to £10,000. Details will be available shortly.
- Small and medium sized businesses who employ between 10 and 249 people can apply for a grant up to £100,000. Details will be available shortly.

#### Economic Resilience Fund

As part of a £500m fund, grants of £10,000 will be available for retailers employing up to 9 people, facing a turnover decline greater than 40% since 1st March 2020. Grants of up to £100,000 are available for retailers with between 10 and 249 employees facing a turnover decline greater than 60%. The Fund is now paused following the very large number of applications to give Welsh Government an opportunity to consider what further support businesses, charities and social enterprises need.

#### Development Bank of Wales Loan Scheme

The Welsh Government and the Development Bank of Wales have announced the £100m Covid-19 Wales Business Loan Scheme to support businesses affected by the Covid-19 outbreak. Loans available between £5,000 – £250,000 with a 12-month capital and interest repayment holiday. More information is available [here](#).

#### Carrier Bag Charge Exemption for Home Deliveries

The Welsh Government has introduced a temporary 3-month exemption (from 9th April) to legal requirements for retailers to charge for single-use carrier bags used for grocery deliveries and collections in Wales. More information is available [here](#).

#### Enforcement of Social Distancing Measures

Guidance on social distancing has been issued by the Welsh Government, outlining that food retailers must take all reasonable measures to ensure that a distance of 2 metres is maintained between person on

the premises and waiting to enter the premises. These measures have been introduced using regulation in Wales and can be enforced by the police and local authorities by issuing fixed penalty notices of £60 to responsible persons.

## Scotland



#### Business Rates Holiday

Retail, leisure and hospitality businesses will receive 100% rates relief for 12 months.

#### Business Rates Relief

There will be 1.6% rates relief for all properties across Scotland, effectively reversing the planned below inflation uplift in the poundage from 1st April 2020. Businesses do not need to apply for this relief as it will be applied to their bill by the local council.

#### Cash Grants

Stores which benefit from the Small Business Bonus Scheme or Rural Relief or have a property within retail, hospitality or leisure with a rateable value not exceeding £18,000 will be entitled to a one-off £10,000 cash grant. £25,000 cash grants will be offered to retail, leisure and hospitality stores with a rateable value between £18,001 and £50,999. Businesses with more than one store will have all subsequent store grants offered at 75% of the initial grant. Businesses can apply now for the grant and should be able to find the application form on their local council website. #### Pivotal Enterprise Resilience Fund

A £45m fund was created to be managed by the Enterprise Agencies for vulnerable SME firms who are vital to the local or national economic foundations of Scotland. [The fund has now closed.](#)

#### Commercial Leases

The Coronavirus (Scotland) Act has extended the notice period before a commercial lease can be terminated for non-payment of rent from fourteen days to fourteen weeks.

#### Critical Workers

The Scottish Government has given [guidance](#) to local authorities about defining 'key workers' to enable them to continue sending their children to school in order to work. This includes workers 'supporting our Critical National Infrastructure' and 'all workers without whom there could be a significant impact on Scotland'. Local authorities will make their own definitions so please check your council website. #### Enforcement of Social Distancing Measures

The Scottish Government has [strengthened its social distancing measures](#) by formalising the two metre distancing rules to all businesses that remain open. Businesses that do not take all reasonable measures to enforce those rules could be fined or ultimately prosecuted.

### Business Rates Holiday

All businesses will pay zero rates for April, May, June, and July 2020. For more information, click [here](#).

### Rate Relief for Specific Sectors

Retail, hospitality, leisure, tourism and childcare businesses will pay no rates for the full financial year up until 31st March 2021.

### Small Business Support Grant Scheme

A cash grant of £10,000 is available to all small businesses with a rateable value up to £15,000. More information is available [here](#). The Grant is also available to businesses who are sole tenants of a rental property, or who own and occupy a property with a total NAV or £1,590 or below. More information is available [here](#). Businesses need to register for the grant scheme by 20th May 2020.

### Retail, Hospitality, Tourism and Leisure Grant

A cash grant of £25,000 is available to businesses in the hospitality, tourism and retail sectors with a rateable value from £15,001 up to £51,000. Businesses need to register for the grant scheme by 20th May 2020. More information is available [here](#). ### Rural ATMs Rates Relief

The rural ATM scheme has been restored which will help to sustain cash flow in isolated rural areas.
